Public's help needed in animal cruelty case

NORTH CHARLESTON, S.C. – Bee had been shot and left in a ditch on Washington Lane in Hollywood, where a responding CCSO Animal Control deputy found her March 14. Despite severe wounds to the face, she was still alive. Deputies took the American Staffordshire mix to the Charleston Animal Society, where she had been adopted the month before. X-ray images showed shotgun pellets riddling the dog's head. Considering the extent of her injuries, Bee was euthanized.

Bee's adoptive family said the dog had been sold to someone else.

Deputies continue to investigate this animal cruelty case and ask anyone with information to step forward. The Charleston Animal Society is offering a \$10,000 for information leading to a felony conviction in the case. Please see the attached flyer.

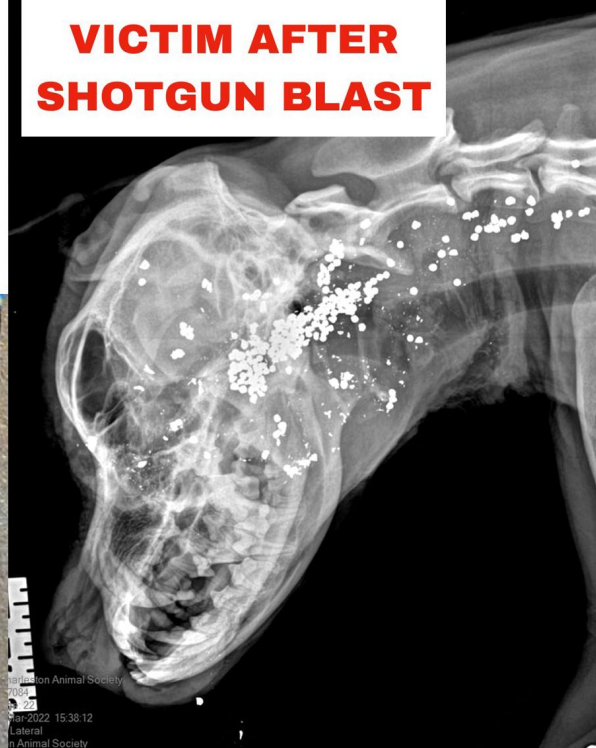
